Understanding the basics

PrEP is short for pre-exposure prophylaxis. PrEP is a medicine you take before you're exposed to HIV to help reduce your chances of getting it.

For PrEP to work, it needs to be taken correctly. This means having enough PrEP in your body at the times when you need protection.

If taken correctly, PrEP can lower your chances of getting HIV by up to 99%.

Options for PrEP

There are two oral options for PrEP and two injectable options. You and your provider can decide which is right for you.

- PrEP prescription and medical visits, including lab tests, are covered by almost all insurance companies, including Medicaid.
- If you are uninsured or underinsured, there are other assistance programs that provide PrEP for free or at a reduced cost.
